"If you will be a servant to this people, be considerate of their needs and respond with compassion, work things out with them, they'll end up doing anything for you." 2 Chronicles 10:7 (Message)

Paul's Pattern Of Leadership

1) Lead By Example

- It is important for leaders to model the kind of ministry they want to see.
- People should practice what they speak and not be caught living by the motto, "Do as I say, not as I do."

1 Corinthians 4:16; 11:1; Philippians 3:17; 4:9; 2 Timothy 3:10,14

2) Establish A Partnership

- You win people's hearts by loving them; which means pray for them, listen to them and build them up.

3) Remain Connected

- Leaders must consistently encourage and motivate others.
- Leader's must always encourage others. Praise what's right and correct what's wrong, but don't create an atmosphere where people are afraid to fail.

Ministers Motivated By Love

- People are often unreasonable, illogical, and self-centered; Forgive them anyway.
- If you are kind, people may accuse you of selfish, ulterior motives, but be kind anyway.

2 Corinthians 12:14-15

Keep On Investing

- Something that's worse than training people and not keeping them is not training people and keeping them.

Search The Pews

- Following is an act of trust, faith in the course of the leader, and that faith can be generated only if leaders act with integrity.
